### Harvest Festival and a call to conversion

Today we celebrate Harvest Festival, and the Mass will involve our children and young people throughout. During the offertory, we will also be collecting any donations of food (non-perishable) or toiletries you might like to bring. These will be donated to the Holy Trinity Food Bank and to the Winter Night Shelter at Holy Innocents. Harvest reminds us as human beings of our utter dependence on God's creation for our food and sustenance.

In recent times, through natural history programmes by people like David Attenborough, and especially through the teaching of Pope Francis in *Laudato Si'*, our awareness of human relatedness to other creatures and the environment has been highlighted. We often speak of the term conversion in our Christian lives and journey; Pope Francis calls every Christian to undergo an 'ecological' conversion. This means coming to a realisation that our love of God and Jesus Christ is inseparable from a duty of proper care for and respect for creation.
